





Amendment of the Constitution.

We will attempt to amend the constitution to make the quorum requirements for an AGM less onerous. It is apparent that this is not the most popular event for members, and many are quite happy to leave it to others to conduct the business side of BIDP. It will also help if we make use of the procedure for appointment of proxies at future meetings.

BIDP prize for architecture students at University of Botswana.

The procedure of awarding a prize for 'Excellence in Integrated Design' will be initiated. This will promote the concept of integrated design, which is a keystone for the achievement of energy efficiency and environmental sustainability in the built environment.

BIDP Directory.

President's Report:

Good evening ladies and gentlemen and welcome to the 30th BIDP AGM.

I would also like to thank members of the council for sacrificing their time and resources to serve BIDP.

The institution is still facing shortage of resources, which has been a problem for some time now. A number of proposals to turn BIDP into a more attentive and self sustaining institution have been discussed at council meetings. However, these have not been implemented. I hope the incoming council will review these and find/decide on a way forward.

We have not had much joy with activities this year:

The joint directory has failed after the publishing company as taken over the new management. We have not had a clear answer from the publisher as to why this has failed.

We were continuing on this as a way of strengthening our relationship with other associations and marketing BIDP.

We have had a presentation of the Airport which was attended by about 7/8 people.

We have submitted comments on the proposed Botswana Building Regulations attended workshops and met with the consultants who drafted the regulations. There was a lot of resistance. We have since made a follow-up on the matter by writing to the Ombudsman and the Attorney's General Chambers. The Ombudsman's response was that this matter is outside the scope of matters they deal with. They have however mentioned that we are on the right track by raising it with the Attorney's General Chambers, and they have also advised us to consider lobbying Members of the Parliaments as it is the executive and the legislature that are responsible for law making.

Botswana Bureau of Standards (BOBS) sends us to sit in meetings for approvals of various standards. However, we do not always get members who can sit in these meetings. We have had Mr Khin sitting in the one on Air Quality in buildings. I hope we will be able to have presentation in more of these meetings and maintain our relationship with BOBS.

I am also happy to let you know that we are now a member of BOCCIM, which offers us a channel to have our issues raised through a more recognised body.

Lastly ladies and gentlemen I would like to thank those who have volunteered /participated in the various tasks for BIDP. The Institution is moving forward because of you input. Thank you to members of the various committees. The Publications Review Committee has been more consistent with their meetings and outputs.

To the incoming council, maybe this is the right time to review our committees and their duties.

Botswana Energy Championship 2008 Competition

About the Championship

By the end of this first one-year competition, every participating company will have had the chance to significantly reduce their energy consumption, their CO2 emissions, and their energy bill. Awards will be presented to the winning competitors at the special VIP Prize Gala, to be held in Gaborone in 2009, to those companies which have demonstrated greatest percentage reduction of energy saved in each field, the best overall in-house employee motivation campaign, and the company which has achieved highest percentage reduction across all competitors.

By participating in the competition, in addition to the opportunities to save money and win prizes, you will:

strengthen the corporate identity and motivation of your staff through active participation in an in-house campaign driven to achieve the common goal of saving energy (and winning the competition, of course).

enhance your organisation's public image through extensive media coverage the press, specialized publications, newsletters, radio and TV features, etc. (centralised support will be provided for all competing companies to disseminate related competition.

benefit from ongoing advice and support throughout the competition.

have the opportunity to acquire a remote data logging devices for monitoring and recording your energy consumption data.

How will the competition be run?

The Botswana Energy Champion 2008 will involve 6 office buildings and 6 schools.

The competition will be launched and start May 2008, and will last for 12 months with the participants submitting energy data at least every month. The data will then be collated and evaluated, with prizes given to the participants that are found to have saved the most, and a large press campaign detailing the success of the competition.

A detailed evaluation of all competition entries will be undertaken by an independent Botswana judging panel and the results published at the competition prize gala to be held in Gaborone in autumn or early winter 2009.

What will the competition achieve?

Among the results of the competition are, first and foremost, energy savings, cost savings and a reduction in CO2 emissions across Botswana through the implementation of a various energy saving measures introduced by the participating organisations.

We expect the Botswana Energy Champion 2008 will also raise substantial publicity for the participating organisations, the project partners and the project sponsors through the various media campaigns planned for The Botswana Energy Champion 2008.

Who can participate?

Only invited companies and schools will be able to participate in this first Energy Champion Competition, which is a pilot competition, set up to wager the benefits and possible savings from this kind of awareness raising efforts. It is the intention that the pilot competition will form a sound foundation for subsequent competitions which will be open for all office buildings and schools in Botswana.

Please note: The Botswana Energy Champion 2008 competition is solely focused on energy saving by behavioural change.

The occupants, employees and personnel of the competing office building are expected to make the savings without investment into energy-saving devices. However, low-cost measures such as the introduction of energy saving light bulbs, adding switches and timers to equipment, and the replacement of written-off equipment by more efficient equipment are allowed, but must be reported to the Competition Secretariat before installation.

In order to ensure a fair competition and to show how much savings can be achieved through behavioural change and low-cost measures alone, any work undertaking structural renovation or modernisation of heating/cooling or lighting infrastructure work during the competition by participating companies will be factored into the final assessment of the results by the competition judging panel.

BRIEFING OF CONSULTANTS ON CRS.

PPADB aims to comprehensively register all entities that are party to the procurement cycle. Thus entities that offers or undertakes services/products in works, supplies, services and combinations thereof should be assessed and registered in terms of their capacity and capability.

A generic criterion developed entails ten (10) broad based attributes. The first five (5) are on the basis or indicative of capacity, the next four (4) are indicators of capability, while the last is based on government policy. The foregoing categorization is primarily for ease of presentation, understanding and as a checklist process since some of the attributes are related and interconnected. The attributes are as follows

The foregoing is further detailed in Table 2 to derive a key indicator in the process of grading. A detailed discussion of the individual attributes is provided in a subsequent publication.

The critical point is that not all attributes or key indicators are applicable for all categories of procurement. Different combinations of attributes and/or key indicators are required for different

The foregoing attributes allow PPADB to respectively have a criterion for grading contractors in a manner that is transparent and accountable. All stakeholders to the registration process are privy to the grading requirements and can police and contest inequity and unfair practices as it occurs. The grading levels depend on the PEs categorization or definition of projects to be undertaken, in terms of scale and complexity of procurement. Differentiation of contractors is therefore undertaken

- Objectively,
- · Applied consistently
- On the basis of fact.
- And divulged for public/stakeholder consumption to ensure transparency and accountability.

RECOMMENDED GRADING LEVELS

The applicable attributes and thresholds to key indicators for a particular service/product contractors' offer or undertake and the scale and complexity of procurement is determined by both the PEs and the contractor associations respectively for each code and sub code

The key principal for grading is that capacity must be nurtured and allowed to grow and blossom. It must therefore be possible in CRS for new players to enter and rejuvenate the playing field. New players must be given the opportunity to compete with similarly graded players. The entry requirements should be balanced and fair. The attribute threshold key indicator requirements must not be barriers to trade nor should they open the floodgates for "chancers" and uncommitted speculation, which will result in poor

delivery standards and lack of integrity. Invariably, the rewards at this level will be lower than at the higher league.

For one to compete effectively and successfully in the higher league one must invest in tools of the trade commensurate with the higher league requirements. The rewards at the higher league have to be commensurate with the risk and sunk commitment.

A general example of how grading is achieved is in order at this juncture. The example assumes that the contractor to be registered is one that offers services. An example being a Civil Engineering firm or entity will only require two levels of grading as shown below

Note that this is an example for illustration purposes and does not necessarily reflect what will finally be the criterion for registration of Civil Engineering Consultant firms. A tick indicates that there will be a threshold requirement while NR indicates that there will be no requirement.

In Figure 1 the requirements for entry are attributes, manpower resources, membership/affiliation and government policy. All the other attributes are not a requirement for entry registration.

The rational for manpower is that there must be a practicing Engineer for the firm or entity to register. The Engineer must be affiliated or a member of a recognized body of practicing Engineers to ensure a certain level of qualification, competency and professional ethics. Finally government policy dictates that entry can only be available for Batswana firms or Motswana entity to ensure that Botswana does not train

expatriates, who are supposed to enter the country already qualified and experienced. Botswana aims to build indigenous capacity.

The foregoing attributes will be debated and agreed between the PEs and once agreed they shall become the grading criterion that is publicized and all civil engineering entities registered with PPADB at entry level must demonstrate those attributes.

In arriving at the foregoing the PEs shall be committing to ensuring that in planning projects, there will be project opportunities for competition at entry level. The project ceiling value for entry level shall thus be determined.

Figure .2 presents differentiation, banding at level 1.

It shall be noted that additional to the entry requirements attributes, financial resources, facilities capacity, track record – experience and management capability have been added. The entry requirements attributes may also have been made more onerous, the threshold increased at level one. For instance manpower resources requirement may now demand a minimum of two employees, whereas at entry the requirement may have been for one employee. The individual associations as per the professional needs of the particular association set these requirements

The government policy may not be retained at level one if it is accepted that it is not necessary. Similarly, the foregoing attributes will be debated and agreed with the PEs and once agreed they shall become the grading criterion that is publicized and all civil engineering entities registered with PPADB at level 1 must demonstrate those attributes.

Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these accounts are set out below:

a) Basis of Preparation

The accounts are prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standards. The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of certain property, plant and equipment, marketable securities and investment properties.

b) Turnover

Turnover represents subscriptions and other sources of income which are recognised on receipt of payment net of value added taxes and discounts. The organisation operates purely on a cash basis and does not grant credit for any aspect of its operations.

Foreign Currencies

Foreign currency transactions are accounted for at the exchange rates prevailing at the date of the transactions. Gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translation of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies, are recognised in the profit and loss account.

d) <u>Depreciation</u>

Depreciation is charged over the estimated useful lives of the assets in equal annual installments to write off each asset over the following peiods.

Stock and work in progress are valued by members of the Council at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Date of Commencement: 27th November, 1959

PARTI

Preliminary (ss 1-2)

Short title

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Arbitration Act.
- Interpretation
- 2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires
- "arbitration" means any proceedings held pursuant to a submission;
- "arbitrator" means any person acting as such pursuant to a submission;
- "Court" means the High Court;
- "official referee" means any referee appointed by the Court in terms of any general rule of Court without reference to any particular matter:
- "special referee" means any particular person appointed to be a referee in any particular matter;
- "submission" means a written agreement, wherever made, to submit present or future differences to arbitration, whether an arbitrator is named therein or not;
- "umpire" means any person acting as such pursuant to a submission.

PART II

References by Consent out of Court (ss 3-21)

Authority of arbitrators and umpires to be irrevocable **3.** The authority of an arbitrator or umpire appointed by or by virtue of a submission shall, unless a contrary intention is expressed in the submission, be irrevocable except by leave of the Court or a judge thereof.

4. A submission, unless a contrary intention is expressed therein, shall be deemed to include the provisions set forth in the Schedule, so far as they are applicable to the reference under the submission.

Submission to include provinces in Schedule

5. Where a submission provides that the reference shall be to an official referee, any official referee to whom application is made shall, subject to any order of Court (or a judge), hear and determine the matters agreed to be referred.

Reference to an official referee

6. (1) If any party to a submission, or any person claiming through or under him, commences any legal proceedings in any court against any other party to the submission, or any person claiming through or under him, in respect to any matter agreed to be referred, any party to such legal proceedings may at any time after appearance, and before delivering any pleadings or taking any other steps in the proceedings, apply to that court to stay the proceedings, and that court, if satisfied that there is no sufficient reason why the matter should not be referred in accordance with the submission, and that the applicant was, at the time when the proceedings were commenced, and still remains, ready and willing to do all things necessary to the proper conduct of the arbitration, may make an order staying the proceedings subject to such terms and conditions as may be just.

Staying of legal proceedings

- (2) The provisions of subsection (1) shall, in the case of the death or insolvency of any party to which it might apply, apply mutatis mutandis to the executor or trustee in the insolvency of such party.
- (3) The death or insolvency of a party to a submission shall not be deemed to revoke such submission.
- 7. Criminal cases, so far as the prosecution or punishment thereof is concerned, shall not be submitted to arbitration, nor, without special leave of the Court, shall any of the following matters be submitted to arbitration —

Matters not to be submitted to arbitration

- (a) matters relating to status;
- b) matrimonial causes;
- (c) matters in which minors or other persons under legal disability may be interested.
- **8.** Where a submission provides that the reference shall be to two arbitrators, one to be appointed by each party, then, unless a contrary intention is expressed therein ---

Power of parties in certain cases to supply vacancy

- (a) if either of the appointed arbitrators refuses to act, or is incapable of acting, or dies, the party who appointed him may appoint a new arbitrator in his place;
- (b) if, on such reference, one party fails to appoint an arbitrator, either originally, or by way of substitution as aforesaid, for seven clear days after the other party, having appointed his

arbitrator, has served the party making default with notice to make the appointment, the party who has appointed an arbitrator may appoint that arbitrator to act as sole arbitrator in the reference and his award shall be binding on both parties as if he had been appointed by consent:

Provided that the Court or a judge thereof may set aside any appointment made in pursuance of this section.

Umpires

- **9.** (1) Unless a contrary intention is expressed therein, every submission shall, where the reference is to two arbitrators, be deemed to include a provision that the two arbitrators shall appoint an umpire immediately after they are themselves appointed.
- (2) Unless a contrary intention is expressed therein, every submission shall, where such a provision is applicable to the reference, be deemed to include a provision that if the arbitrators have delivered to any party to the submission, or to the umpire, a notice in writing stating that they cannot agree, the umpire may forthwith enter on the reference in lieu of the arbitrators.
- (3) At any time after the appointment of an umpire, however appointed, the Court may, on the application of any party to the reference and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the submission, order that the umpire shall enter upon the reference in lieu of the arbitrators and as if he were a sole arbitrator.

Reference to three arburators

- 10. (1) Where a submission provides that the reference shall be to three arbitrators, one to be appointed by each party and the third to be appointed by the two appointed by the parties, the submission shall have effect as if it provided for the appointment of an umpire, and not for the appointment of a third arbitrator, by the two arbitrators appointed by the parties.
- (2) Where a submission provides that the reference shall be to three arbitrators to be appointed otherwise than as mentioned in subsection (1), the award of any two of the arbitrators shall be binding.

Power of Court in certain cases to appoint an arbitrator or umpire

- 11. In any of the following cases -
- (a) where a submission provides that the reference shall be to a single arbitrator, and all the parties do not, after differences have arisen, concur in the appointment of an arbitrator;
- (b) if an appointed arbitrator refuses to act, or is incapable of acting, or dies, and the submission does not show that it was intended that the vacancy should not be supplied and the parties do not supply the vacancy;

- (c) where the parties or two arbitrators are at liberty to appoint an umpire or third arbitrator and do not appoint him, or where two arbitrators are required to appoint an umpire and do not appoint him;
- (d) where an appointed umpire or third arbitrator refuses to act, or is incapable of acting, or dies, and the submission does not show that it was intended that the vacancy should not be supplied, and the parties or arbitrators do not supply the vacancy,

any party may serve the other parties or the arbitrators, as the case may be, with a written notice to appoint or, as the case may be, concur in appointing an arbitrator, umpire or third arbitrator, and if the appointment is not made within seven clear days after the service of the notice, the Court or a judge thereof may, on application by the party who gave the notice, appoint an arbitrator, umpire or third arbitrator who shall have the like powers to act in the reference and make an award as if he had been appointed by consent of all parties.

12. Every arbitrator and umpire must be and continue throughout the reference to be disinterested with reference to the matters referred and the parties to the reference, and any party to a reference may require any arbitrator or umpire to make a sworn declaration before beginning or continuing his duties as such arbitrator or umpire, that he has no interest (direct or indirect) in the matter referred or the parties to the reference, and knows of nothing disqualifying him from being impartial and disinterested in the discharge of such duties:

Arbitrators and umpires to be distinierested parties

Provided that any party may expressly waive any right to object to any arbitrator or umpire on the ground of interest or the like.

13. (1) The Court may at any time, upon motion, remove any arbitrator or umpire against whom a just ground of recusation is found to exist, or who has misconducted the proceedings in connection with the arbitration.

Court's powers to remove arbitrator or umpire, to set award aside and to award costs

- (2) Where an arbitrator or umpire has misconducted the proceedings, or an arbitration or award has been improperly procured, the Court may set the award aside, and may award costs against any such arbitrator or umpire personally.
- 14. The fees made payable to any arbitrator or umpire by an award, notwithstanding that such fees may have already been paid by the parties, shall be subject to taxation at the expense of the parties desiring taxation by the taxing officer of the Court, with the right of appeal to the Court:

Taxation of fees

Provided that --

- (i no taxation or reduction of such fees shall be allowed if they are in accordance with any agreement between the arbitrator or umpire concerned and the party applying for taxation, and
- (ii) the party applying for taxation and the arbitrator or umpire, taxation of whose fees is thus applied for, shall be entitled to appear before and be heard by the Court in the matter of such taxation.

Process of arbitrator or unique

- 15. The arbitrator or umpire acting under a submission shall, unless the submission expresses a contrary intention, have power
 - (a) to administer oaths or to take the affirmations of the parties and witnesses appearing;
 - (b) to correct in any award any clerical mistake or error arising from any accidental slip or omission; and
 - (c) on the application of either party to appoint a commissioner to take the evidence of a person residing outside Botswana and forward the same to arbitrators in the same way as if he were a commissioner appointed by the Court.

Interlocutors powers of Cours

- **16.** (1) Any party to a submission may take out process of the Court for the attendance of witnesses, but no person shall be compelled under any such process to produce any document which he could not be compelled to produce on the trial of any action.
- (2) Any party to a submission is entitled, subject to the law relating to procedure of the Court, to obtain from the Court an order -
 - (a) for the examination of a witness or witnesses before a special examiner either in Botswana or elsewhere;
 - (b) for the discovery of documents and interrogatories;
 - $\langle \epsilon \rangle$ for evidence to be given by affidavit in the same circumstances as in litigation;
 - (d) for another party to give security for costs in the same way as a litigant;
 - (e) for the inspection, or the interim preservation, or the sale of goods or property, the subject matter of the arbitration;
 - (f) for an interim injunction or similar relief;
 - (g) for directing an issue by way of interpleader between two parties to a submission for the relief of a third party desiring so to interplead;
 - (h) for substituted service of notices required by this Act, including service upon an agent in Botswana of a party resident elsewhere.

17. (1) Subject to the provisions of section 19(2), and anything to the contrary in the submission, an arbitrator or umpire shall have power to make an award at any time.

Time for making award

- (2) The time, if any, limited for making an award, whether under this Act or otherwise, may from time to time be enlarged by order of the Court or a judge thereof, whether that time has expired or not.
- 3) The Court may, on the application of any party to a reference, remove an arbitrator or umpire who fails to use all reasonable dispatch in entering on and proceeding with the reference and making an award, and an arbitrator or umpire who is removed by the Court under this subsection shall not be entitled to receive any remuneration in respect of his services.
- 4) For the purposes of subsection (3), the expression "proceeding with the reference" includes, in a case where two arbitrators are unable to agree, giving notice of that fact to the parties and to the umpire.

18. Unless a contrary intention is expressed therein, every submission shall, where such a provision is applicable to the reference, be deemed to contain a provision that the arbitrator or umpire may, if he thinks fit, make an interim award, and any reference in this Part of this Act to an award includes a reference to an interim award.

Interior awards

19. (1) In all cases of reference to arbitration the Court may from time to time remit the matters referred, or any of them, for the reconsideration of the arbitrators or umpire.

Remasion of case by Court

- (2) When an award is remitted, the arbitrators or umpire shall, unless the Court otherwise directs, make their award within three months after the date of the order.
- 20. An award on a submission may, by leave of the Court or a judge thereof, be enforced in the same manner as a judgment or order to the same effect, and where leave is so given, judgment may be entered in terms of the award.

Enforcement of

21. Where the submission does not provide in what place the arbitration shall be held, the arbitrators or umpire may from time to time decide upon such place as may be reasonably accessible to the parties and convenient for the purposes of the reference.

Procedure when place of arbitration not provided for in submission

PART III

References under Order of Court (ss 22-27)

22. Subject to rules of Court, the Court may refer any questions arising in any case or matter for inquiry or report to any official or special referee or officer of the Court.

Reference for report on questions arising in a cause

Procedure on receipt of report by Court

23. The report of any official or special referee or officer of the Court may be adopted wholly or partially by the Court, and with or without such amendments as to the Court may seem meet, and when so adopted may be enforced as a judgment to the same effect; or the Court may remit the report for further consideration, or make such other order thereon as to it may seem just.

Reference of vertain matters for trial before referee or arbitrator

- 24. In any cause or matter -
- (a) if all the parties interested who are not under disability consent;
- (b) if the cause or matter requires any prolonged examination of documents or any scientific, technical or local investigation which cannot, in the opinion of the Court, conveniently be made or conducted by the Court; or
- (c) if the question in dispute consists wholly or in part of matters of account,

the Court may at any time order the whole cause or matter, or any question or issue of fact arising therein, to be tried before a special referee or arbitrator agreed on by the parties, or, failing agreement, appointed by the Court, or before any official referee or officer of the Court appointed by the Court.

Office and authority of such referee, etc.

25. In all cases of reference to an officer of the Court or to an official or special referee or arbitrator under an order of the Court in any cause or matter, the official or special referee shall be deemed to be an officer of the Court, and they, or any such officer of the Court, shall have such authority and shall conduct the reference in such manner as may be prescribed by any special order or by rules of Court.

Force of report or award 26. The report or award of any officer of the Court, official or special referee or arbitrator on any such reference shall, unless set aside by the Court, be equivalent to a finding of fact by the Court.

Powers of Court

27. The Court shall, as to references under order of the Court, have all the powers which are by this Act conferred on the Court as to references by consent out of Court.

PART IV

Miscellaneous (ss 28-32)

Subpoena or

- 28. The issue of a subpoena or summons on a witness to compel his attendance and the production of things or documents before an arbitrator, umpire, officer of the Court and official or special referee, as the case may be, may be procured in the same way and subject to the same conditions as if the matter were an action pending in the Court
 - (a) by any party to a submission, or any arbitrator, or umpire thereunder;

(b) by the parties to any reference under any order of Court; or

Arbitration

(c) by any officer of the Court, official or special referee hearing any reference under order of Court:

Provided that -

- (i) no person shall be compelled on such subpoena to produce any document or thing the production of which would not be compellable on trial of an action; and
- (ii) the clerk of the court of any magistrate may issue such subpoena in the name and on behalf of the Registrar of the Court upon payment of the same fees as are chargeable for the issue of a subpoena in the magistrate's court.
- 29. The Court or a judge may order the process of the Court to issue to compel the attendance before a special or official referee, or officer of the Court, or before an arbitrator or umpire, of a witness, wherever he may be, within the jurisdiction of the Court or judge, or may order any prisoner to be brought up for examination before such officer, referee, arbitrator or umpire.

General powers of Court or judge

30. (1) An arbitrator or umpire may, and shall if so directed by the Court, state -

Statement of

- (a) any question of law arising in the course of the reference; or
- (b) an award or any part of an award,
- in the form of a special case for the decision of the Court.
- (2) A special case with respect to an interim award or with respect to a question of law arising in the course of a reference may be stated, or may be directed by the Court to be stated, notwithstanding that proceedings under the reference are still pending.

31. Any order made under this Act may be made on such terms as to costs or otherwise as the authority making the order thinks just.

32. Any person who wilfully or corruptly gives false evidence before any such officer, referee, arbitrator or umpire shall be guilty of perjury in the same way as if the evidence had been given in open Court, and may be dealt with, prosecuted and punished accordingly.

False evidence

SCHEDULE PROVISIONS TO BE IMPLIED IN SUBMISSION

(section 4)

- 1. If no other mode of reference is provided, the reference shall be to a single arbitrator.
- 2. If the reference is to two arbitrators, then for the decision of any question they must both agree, but if to more than two, then, subject to the provisions of section 10, the decision of the majority of the arbitrators shall determine any questions.
- 3. If the reference is to two or more arbitrators, they may appoint an unpire at any time within the period during which they have power to make an award.
- 4. If the arbitrator or arbitrators have allowed the time or time as extended by the Court to expire without making an award, or have delivered to any party to the submission or the umpire a written notice stating that they cannot agree, the umpire may forthwith enter on the reference in lieu of the arbitrators.
- 5. The parties to the reference and all parties claiming through them respectively shall, subject to any legal objection, submit to be examined by the arbitrator or arbitrators or umpire on oath or affirmation in relation to the matters in dispute, and shall produce before the arbitrator, arbitrators or umpire all books, deeds, papers, accounts, writings, documents and things within their possession or power respectively, which may be required or called for and production of which could be compelled on the trial of an action.
- **6.** The witnesses on the reference shall, if the arbitrator, arbitrators or umpire think fit, be examined on oath or affirmation.
- 7. The oral evidence of witnesses shall be recorded by the arbitrator, arbitrators or umpire before whom it may be given in such manner as may be by him from time to time directed, if not recorded by the arbitrator, arbitrators or umpire themselves.
- **8.** The umpire shall be at liberty to act upon the evidence recorded before the arbitrators and to make his award without hearing any witnesses or receiving any fresh evidence:

Provided that he shall be entitled, if he so thinks fit, to re-hear the witnesses or any of them or to call for further evidence.

9. The umpire shall be at liberty to sit together with the arbitrators and to hear the evidence given from time to time, and shall be entitled then and there to decide any interlocutory matter upon which the arbitrators disagree:


Provided that the umpire shall not, unless called upon to give an award, or unless the parties have requested him so to sit, be entitled to demand remuneration from the parties in respect of his attendance on the reference with the arbitrators.

- 10. If the arbitrators, where there are more than one, or a majority of them, cannot agree as to any matter of procedure or any interlocutory question, they may refer such matter or question forthwith to the umpire for decision, and he shall give his decision thereon forthwith.
- 11. The arbitrator, arbitrators or umpire shall be at liberty to proceed ex parte in case any party after reasonable notice shall at any time neglect or refuse to attend on the reference without having shown previously to them what they consider good and sufficient cause for omitting to attend.
- 12. If any party to the arbitration dies, the arbitration shall be stayed, subject to any order that the Court may make, until the appointment of an executor or other proper representative of such deceased party, and the time for making an award shall be extended for the same period as may clapse between the death of the party and the appointment of an executor or other proper representative, and such executor or other proper representative shall, when called upon by the other party or parties to the submission to proceed with the arbitration; be subject to the same rules, provisions and conditions as the deceased party.
- 13. The award to be made by the arbitrator, arbitrators or umpire shall be in writing, and shall, if made in terms of the submission, be final and binding on the parties and the persons claiming under them respectively.
- 14. The costs of the reference and award shall be in the discretion of the arbitrator, arbitrators or umpire, who may direct to and by whom and in what manner such costs or any part thereof shall be paid, and may tax or settle the amount of costs to be so paid or any part thereof, and may award costs to be paid as between attorney and client:

Provided that ==

- i. if no direction is given as to the scale on which such costs are to be taxed, they shall be taxed on the tariff allowed in magistrates' courts from time to time if the award is such as a magistrate's court might have pronounced as a judgment in such court, but otherwise such costs shall be taxed on the tariff in force from time to time in the Courts, and
- $\langle ii \rangle$ if the arbitrator, arbitrators or umpire do not forthwith tax such costs, or if the arbitrators cannot agree in their taxation, then the taxing officer of the Court may tax them.
